#### Policy:

- Completed 30 day public comment on revised Standard Form 86 through the Federal Register all 732 technical comments have been resolved.
- Proposed Standard Executive Branch eAdjudication business rules for NACLC (Secret) cases in coordination with Security Executive agent for approval and issuance - Legal review complete, pending signature.
- OPM coordinated initial draft of revised policy with DoD and ODNI to broaden sensitive position designations (5 CFR 732). Anticipate near term posting in the Federal Register for public comment.
- Drafted changes to Federal Regulations to define requirements to reinvestigate individuals in public trust positions under EO 13488. The Federal Register public comment period ended 4 January 2010. Public comments are being reviewed by OPM prior to publishing reinvestigation requirements for public trust positions.
- Drafted revised Federal Investigative Standards for initial investigations of positions at Tier 1 (low risk, non-sensitive) Tier 2 (moderate risk public trust) and Tier 3 (non-critical sensitive, and Secret clearances). The draft standards include models for expandable focused investigation and select automated record checks, as appropriate, to each tier level. The methodology to conduct a cost and timeliness analysis of each draft tier has been developed and is in the coordination process.
- Inter-agency Federal Investigation Standards Working Group (FISWG) will meet in late January to address continuous evaluation requirements at Tier 3 and begin discussions on Tier 4 requirements.
- Expert working group within Intelligence Community is conducting research to inform the development of Federal Investigative Standards for access to Top Secret/SCI access (Tier 4).

#### Information Technology:

- Deployed OPM's enhanced online investigations questionnaire (eQIP). Includes Inproved data entry validation and additional branching questions.
- Preliminary requirements collection for the next release of eQIP that will incorporate the revisions to the SF-86 is complete. Final requirements collection will be completed after final approval of the revised SF86.
- Deployed eAdjudication at the Department of the Navy Central Adjudication Facility (CAF) to provide electronic delivery and identify and electronically adjudicate Secret-level cases that have no actionable issues present. The Army CAF and the Defense Industrial Security Clearance Office CAF are already on line.
  - Enabled electronic delivery (eDelivery) of investigative packages from OPM to Air Force. Deployment of Air Force electronic adjudication expected by February 2010.



#### Policy:

- OMB is leading the Reform Effort review of revisions to the proposed language for part 732 to broaden sensitive
  position designation prior to entering the Federal Register process for public comment.
- Orafted minimum data standards necessary to support reciprocity were approved by the Security and Suitability Executive Agents designated representatives on 17 June 2010
- OPM is scheduled to provide their analysis of the impact of the proposed tiered standards to the cost and timeliness of their product line by the end of July. Analysis and research by the JRT will follow to achieve a comparison of traditional investigative cost and timeliness in an end-to-end reformed approach.
- OPM will re-publish 5 CFR 731 in the Federal Register for limited period to address agency concerns on relinvestigation requirements for individuals in public trust positions under EO 13488. Anticipate publication in the Federal Register in July 2010.
- OPM updated its System of Records Notice (SORN) and posted it in the Federal Register on May 20, 2010 for a 30-day public notice. Approval of the SORN will permit agencies to forward OPM-conducted investigations to DOD's Case Adjudication Tracking System (CATS) for electronic adjudication. OPM is working with DOE to approve their role ase of investigative records for electronic adjudication by the DoD system based upon the updated SORN language.
- OPM has met with several Cabinat level agencies to discuss the proposed FY2011 product line, which will align
  existing investigative products with reform concepts (2010 Reform deliverable) and addressed specific agency
  impacts. A broader executive branch meeting occurred on 29 June 2010. The proposed products will include
  enhanced subject interviews triggered by issues flags, and standardized coverage to support reciprocity.

Pilot was echeduled to begin in early April, however a protest to the contract award was filed with GAO. Contract protest was withdrawn. Pilot activities have recommenced. System certification and accreditation process is under way.
- The OPM-ACES Automated Records Checks (ARC) pilot is proceeding. 400 initial DoO cases were processed between DoD, OPM and PERSEREC. Initial adjustments to the search and reporting process are ongoing. A second round of 400 cases is expected to be initiated in July. The process and quantity for a statistically algnificant pilot will be finalized following the successful analysis of the second round of test cases.

### Governance:

- The PAC Training Subcommittee program of instruction designed to address PAC hational suitability adjudication training standards was piloted April 19-30 and June 14-25. OPM conducted pilot testing of a new training course, entitled Fundamentals of Sultability Review and Adjudication, for suitability adjudicators. By the end of 2010, OPM anticipates the course will be available for open enrollment to the suitability adjudicator community.

- The National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) end-to-end electronic data pilot using US Army recruit cases is expected to start running cases in November following completion of interagency memorandums of agreement.
- The OPM-ACES Automated Records Checks (ARC) pilot has completed processing of the second group of 400 DoD cases. Data analysis has begun, with results expected in November.

- As part of the goal to expand the use of eDelivery, OPM deployed Electronic File Release to agencies currently





#### Policy:

- The Reform Effort review of changes to the proposed language for 5 CFR part 732 to broaden sensitive position
  designation has concluded. Prior to publication in the Federal Register for public comment, the Office of
  Management and Budget (OMB) conducted an Inter-agency review per the regulatory process. OMB has
  concluded that process, and the regulation was published in the Federal Register on 14 December 2010 for a 60day comment period.
- The Federal Investigative Standards Working Group (FISWG) continued their review and consideration of the cost and timeliness results and made further revisions to the proposed Tiers 1-3 investigative standards and expandable focused investigation models. Draft Tiers 1-3 standards were forwarded for formal executive branch agency coordination on December 27.
- The Intelligence Community Working Group (ICWG) completed studies to inform the investigative standards development. The FISWG was briefed on the ICWG findings on December 7, 2010.
- OPM re-published 5 CFR part 731 in the Federal Register on November 5, 2010 for a 30-day comment period to
  address agency concerns on reinvestigation requirements for individuals in public trust positions under Executive
  Order 13488. The public comment period closed on December 6, 2010 and OMB is in process of adjudicating
  comments.

#### Information Technology:

- The 2010 version of the SF 86 was moved into the e-QIP production environment on December 17, 2010. OPM will host orientation/training for its customers and other Investigative Service Providers (ISP's) in January. OPM continues to work with other ISP's and with representatives of other agencies with Personnel Security/ Adjudication systems and non e-QIP SF 86 data collection systems as they progress with their individual implementation schedules.
- The National Reconnaissance Office (NRO) and-to-end electronic data pilot using US Army recruit cases is expected to begin in January following the completion of two interagency memorandums of agreement.
- The OPM-ACES Automated Records Checks (ARC) pllot has been expanded to include 4,000 cases that will
  provide a statistically relevant sample from which to conduct analysis and draw conclusions.

- In September 2010, the Performance Accountability Council (PAC) issued a request for executive branch
  coordination on proposed Investigative and Security and Suitability adjudicative training standards. Responses to
  that coordination were briefed to the PAC and incorporated into the approval packages for Security and Suitability
  executive agents.
- Joint Reform Team (JRT) implementation assistance visits were completed with three executive branch agencies. Additional assistance visits are scheduled with a focus on agencies not currently meeting IRTPA requirements. Initial observations and findings from those visits were provided to the PAC in December and included agencies reporting: Lengthy processes for obtaining funding for Information Technology (IT) changes; multiple IT systems at subordinate agency organizations causing connectivity challenges; lack of control over subordinate agency priorities; agencies with populations that require subject interviews take longer to adjudicate. The Security Executive Agent in coordination with the JRT will be requesting that agencies not meeting IRTPA timeliness goals provide their formal agency plan of action and milestone documentation for review and JRT/PAC engagement as necessary.



#### Policy:

- Proposed revisions to 5 CFR Part 732, to broaden sensitive position designation was published in the Federal Register on December 14, 2010 for a 60-day comment period. Comments are due to the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) on February 14, 2011.
- The Performance Accountability Council (PAC) forwarded proposed draft Tiers 1-3 Federal Investigative Standards and Expandable Focused Investigation models for formal executive branch agency coordination on December 27, 2010. Formal agency comments are due February 4, 2011.
- OPM re-published 5 CFR Part 731 in the Federal Register on November 5, 2010 for a 30-day comment period to address agency concerns regarding reinvestigation requirements for individuals in public trust positions under Executive Order 13488. The public comment period closed on December 6, 2010 and the Office of Management and Budget is adjudicating comments.
- OPM published the proposed revised Questionnaire for Public Trust Positions (SF 85P) and the Supplemental Questionnaire for Selected Positions (SF 85P-S) in the Federal Register on December 29, 2010. The general public and federal agencies have 60 days to comment on these information collection forms. Comments are due to OPM by February 28, 2011.

## Information Technology:

- SInce implementation of the 2010 version of the SF 88 in the e-QIP production environment in December 2010, ,
  the Department of State, has begun using the new form in its investigative process. OPM is hosting multiple
  orientation/training sessions for its customers and other ISPs this month. OPM continues to work with other ISPs
  and representatives from other agencies with Personnel Security/ Adjudication systems and non e-QIP SF 86
  data collection systems as they progress with their individual implementation schedules.
- The National Reconnaissance Office end-to-end electronic data pilot using U.S. Army recruit cases is expected to begin in February following completion of two interagency memorandums of agreement.
- OPM's Automated Continuous Evaluation System (ACES) Automated Records Checks pilot was expanded to
  include 4,000 cases that will provide a statistically relevant sample from which to conduct analysis and draw
  conclusions. The pilot identified several anomalies in the ACES software. The cause of these anomalies is being
  corrected while the pilot continues.
- As a result of process improvements and EPIC Transformation initiatives, which included implementation of event
  driven architecture and a redesign of the Fingerprint Transaction System, OPM realized tremendous timeliness
  improvements. At the close of Calendar Year 2008, electronic submissions were processed (i.e., receipt from
  customer, processing at OPM, search of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), results returned to OPM) in an
  average of 38 hours. This improved to less than 3 hours in November 2010. Similarly, hard card submissions
  were taking 65 hours in 2008 and have improved to less than 26 hours in November 2010. Additional
  programming changes are pending as well as further discussions with the FBI to improve the fingerprint name
  check process.

- In September 2010, the PAC issued a request for executive branch coordination on proposed Investigative and Security and Suitability adjudicative training standards. Responses to that coordination were briefed to the PAC and incorporated into approval packages for Security and Suitability Executive Agents. Standards were transmitted to the Security and Suitability Executive Agents for approval and implementation.
- The Joint Reform Team (JRT) completed implementation assistance visits with three executive branch agencies.
   Additional assistance visits are scheduled with a focus on agencies not currently meeting IRTPA requirements.

Initial observations and findings from those visits were provided to the PAC in December and included agencies reporting: lengthy processes for obtaining funding for Information Technology (IT) changes; multiple IT systems at subordinate agency organizations causing connectivity challenges; lack of control over subordinate agency priorities; agencies with populations requiring subject interviews take longer to adjudicate. The Security Executive Agent in coordination with the JRT will request agencies not meeting IRTPA timeliness goals provide their formal agency plan of action and milestone documentation for review and JRT/PAC engagement as necessary. Action plans have started to come in.

- Executive branch agencies were briefed on proposed changes to the federal investigative standards for Tiers 1
  through 3, the proposed revisions to 5 CFR Part 732 and proposed revisions to the questionnaires for public trust
  positions at a Joint Sultability and Security Reform Effort briefing on January 19, 2011. This session was
  designed to provide agencies with an interactive forum to discuss these issues as they prepare their formal
  agency comments.
- In its February 2010 Security and Suitability Process Reform Strategic Framework document, the PAC defined 30 key deliverables for 2010, of which 24 are now complete. From a timeliness perspective, four quarters after the deadline to meet the December 2009 IRTPA goals, the Government as a whole continues to meet the 60 day goal for investigations and adjudications, as well as the overall PAC end-to-end timeliness goal of 74 days.



  review by the Reform Effort leadership.
- OPM re-published 5 CFR Part 731 in the Federal Register on November 5, 2010, for a 30-day comment period to address agency concerns regarding reinvestigation requirements for individuals in public trust positions under Executive Order 13488. OPM is reviewing comments which include recommendations by agencies related to alignment of processes within the 5 CFR Part 732 revisions.
- OPM published the proposed revised Questionnaire for Public Trust Positions (SF 85P) and the Supplemental Questionnaire for Selected Positions (SF 85P-S) in the Federal Register on December 29, 2010, for a 60-day comment period, which concluded February 28, 2011. OPM is currently reviewing the extensive comments and evaluating the questions posed.

#### Information Technology:

- Since Implementation of the 2010 version of the SF 86 in the e-QIP production environment in December 2010, four agencies are now using the new form in their investigative processes: the Department of State, Agency for International Development, Peace Corps, and the Office of Personnel Management. OPM began a phased approach to implementing use of this new form with customer agencies beginning in late March. The activated customers for OPM are: Government Printing Office, National Credit Union Administration, and OPM's own personnel security entities. OPM also continues to work with representatives from agencies with personnel security/adjudication systems and non e-QIP SF 86 data collection systems as they progress with their individual implementation schedules.
- The National Reconnaissance Office end-to-end electronic data pilot using U.S. Army recruit cases began April 25.
- The OPM/Automated Continuous Evaluation System (ACES) Automated Records Checks pilot was expanded to
  include 4,000 cases to provide a statistically relevant sample from which to conduct analysis and draw conclusions.
  The pilot as of 29 April has coded 1,598 cases, 387 cases have undergone quality review, PERSEREC has sent
  4,045 cases to OPM, and OPM has closed 4,002 cases.
- The Department's e-Adjudication Web service became available in February 2011 and is being utilized by the Department of Energy. To date 331 cases have been processed with 58% of the cases being e-determined.

- In September 2010, the PAC issued a request for executive branch coordination on proposed Security and Suitability
  investigative and adjudicative training standards. Responses to that coordination request were briefed to the PAC
  and incorporated into approval packages for Security and Suitability Executive Agents. Standards were transmitted to
  the Security and Suitability Executive Agents for approval and implementation. Approval letters are currently in the
  final signature process.
- In March the Security Executive Agent, in coordination with the Joint Reform Team, requested agencies not meeting IRTPA timeliness goals provide their formal agency plan of action and milestone documentation. Action plans have been submitted and are under review.

On April15, the Security Executive Agent held an Advisory Committee meeting to provide updates on National
personnel security initiatives and facilitate greater information sharing across Executive Branch agencies. The
meeting included 87 participants with 33 Agencies represented. As a result, new inter-agency working groups will be
formed to address on-going personnel security initiatives.
