DNI Announces New Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Collection

The Director of National Intelligence announced that Glenn A. Gaffney will join the Office of the Director of National Intelligence as the Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Collection. In this role, Mr. Gaffney will work on behalf of the DNI to coordinate and integrate the collection efforts of the 16 intelligence agencies and ensure that DNI priorities are appropriately reflected in future planning and systems acquisition decisions.

The DDNI/Collection is a key driver of the DNI's 500-Day Plan efforts to foster collection and analytic transformation by strengthening integration, collaboration, and tradecraft. This focus area examines ways to bolster penetration of and collection against the Community's hardest targets and success in this area depends on increased transparency and collaboration between analysts and collectors.

Mr. Gaffney is currently serving as CIA's Deputy Director for Science and Technology (DS&T), a position he has held since November 2006. Prior to his current assignment, Mr. Gaffney served in a variety of positions in the CIA.

Mr. Gaffney is a 1986 graduate of the New Jersey Institute of Technology with a degree in engineering science with an emphasis in astrophysics.

Mr. Gaffney replaces Mary Margaret Graham, the first DDNI/Collection under the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004, who will retire effective 7 January.
