Position Information

This is an opportunity for:

- Internal candidates to fill a GS-15 cadre position.
- A Federal Government employee to serve on a two-year reimbursable detail assignment in the ODNI. The detail assignment may be extended an additional year if all parties agree.

Who May Apply

Current GS employees at the same grade or up to one grade below may apply.

Former members of the Peace Corps may be considered for ODNI employment only if five full years have elapsed since separation from the Peace Corps.

- For a detailee assignment:
 - Current Federal Government employees. (Current GS employees at the same grade or up to one grade below may apply.)



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Component Mission:

The Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) Deputy Director of Mission Integration (MI) serves as the Director of National Intelligence's (DNI) senior leader for intelligence integration across the IC enterprise. MI is responsible for ensuring customer outcomes by leading advances in collection and analysis that ensure the quality, timeliness, and utility of insights for the nation's decision-makers. Additionally, MI is responsible for increasing expertise and improving tradecraft at all levels through specialization, integration, and collaboration. MI is responsible for the strategic vision, direction, and planning to deliver a more integrated IC reflecting the collective wisdom of our collection and analytic components to advance, in support of the National Intelligence Managers, the Unifying Intelligence Strategies (UIS).

Major Duties and Responsibilities:

- Supports the Economic Security and Financial Intelligence Executive (EFX) and National Intelligence Manager facilitate enterprise-wide integration of the Intelligence Community's (IC) analytic, collection, counterintelligence and supporting capabilities related to the sanctions mission;
- Develop and administer EFX programmatic operations driving intelligence support for the full range of targeted financial measures, including financial sector advisories, financial regulations, foreign engagement, law enforcement operations, kinetic operations and sanctions.
- Support efforts to advance the IC's use of financial data to support mission outcomes.
- Maintain situational awareness of significant issues affecting targeted financial measures across the IC and alert senior leadership regarding emerging issues that affect the mission.
- Lead cross-ODNI efforts, in response to broad objectives and guidelines from supervisor, to include joint initiatives with other NIMs on sanctions and financial data integration where equities overlap.
- Support EFX participation in high-level policy meetings with talking points, background information, and the results of relevant engagements IC agencies.
- Represent EFX leadership, in their absence at required meetings, conferences, sub-IPC level policy meetings, and other fora.
- Serve as the EFX representative for developing, executing, and evaluating, related portions of the office's Unified Intelligence Strategy;
- Foster and cultivate strategic alliances and professional networks with agency partners to facilitate priority attention on the sanctions elements of the National Intelligence Strategy, Unifying Intelligence Strategy, Consolidated Intelligence Guidance and National Intelligence Priorities Framework.
- Lead the development and preparation of internal and external memoranda, tasking responses and other correspondence to include policy analysis documents in response to tasking from policymakers.



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- Support efforts to develop, align and monitor resources and budget allocations in support of current and future projects, informing investment decision-making and meeting internal DNI suspense, and formal IPPBE deadlines and milestones.
- Collaborate on and lead other mission management elements of the economic security and financial intelligence portfolio, as directed by EFX leadership.
- Support briefings to senior IC officials and other major stakeholders collaboration progress, issues and challenges.

Mandatory Requirements:

- Extensive knowledge of targeted financial measures and demonstrated working experience in sanctions, threat finance, financial intelligence, economics or a related field.
- Knowledge of IC organizations; IC mission posture, structures, capabilities, processes, and policy development coupled with the ability to lead interagency working groups, build coalitions with IC elements to achieve common goals.
- Demonstrated analytical and critical thinking skills, including the ability to think strategically, identify needs and requirements, develop recommendations, and evaluate outcomes against goals and objectives.

Desired:

- Superior oral and written communication skills, including superior ability to draft and edit written reports of varying length and complexity, and to communicate effectively with audiences of varying seniority and expertise.
- Ability to design and implement integration strategies for IC initiatives and programs, with a particular interest in those who have worked on programs leveraging data, technology or information sharing.
- Knowledge of the Intelligence Planning, Programming, Budget, and Evaluation (IPPBE) process.

CURRENT FEDERAL EMPLOYEES APPLYING FOR A DETAIL ASSIGNMENT:

Applicants from federal agencies within the Intelligence Community (IC) may be considered for this position as a reimbursable detailee, if endorsed by the employing agency. Applicants must have current TS/SCI clearances with polygraph or have the ability to obtain one. The ODNI does not conduct polygraphs or provide security clearances for detailees. ***Applicants from within the IC must submit an application through the classified IC Joint Duty Program website.***

Applicants from federal agencies outside the IC must provide:

- a. **WRITTEN ENDORSEMENT** from the employing agency concurring with the detail.
- b. **RESUME:** Applicants are encouraged to carefully review the vacancy announcement, particularly the MDRs, and construct their resume to highlight their most significant experience and qualifications relevant to this job opportunity.
- c. **PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS:** Applicants are required to provide their two most recent performance evaluations. A justification is required in the cover letter if the applicant is unable to provide the two most recent evaluations.
- d. **VACANCY NUMBER:** Reference the vacancy number in the subject line of the email and on each document submitted.
- e. **CURRENT SF-50:** Federal Government employees must provide an SF-50, "Notification of Personnel Action" to verify current federal status, position, title, grade, and organization of record. Please disregard if you are not a Federal Government employee.
- f. **COVER LETTER:** Applicants must submit a cover letter as a supplement to the resume to elaborate on their qualifications and previous work performed.
