Position Information

This is an opportunity for:

- An internal candidate to fill a GS-15 cadre position.
- A Federal Government employee to serve on a two-year reimbursable detail assignment in the ODNI. The detail assignment may be extended an additional year if all parties agree.

Who May Apply

Current GS employees at the same grade as the advertised position grade may apply.

Former members of the Peace Corps may be considered for ODNI employment only if five full years have elapsed since separation from the Peace Corps.

- For a cadre assignment:
 - Current ODNI permanent cadre.
- For a detailee assignment:



- Current Federal Government employees at the same grade as the advertised grade may apply.

Salary Determination

- The ODNI uses a rank-in-person system in which rank is attached to the individual. A selected ODNI candidate will be assigned to the position at the employee's current GS grade and salary.
- A current Federal Government employee, selected for a detail assignment, will be assigned to the position at his or her current grade and salary.

Component Mission

The Policy and Capabilities Directorate is focused on ensuring the IC is best postured to meet the future challenges and threats confronting our nation.

Major Duties and Responsibilities (MDRs)

Engage and influence key stakeholders to support the ODNI's Key objectives.

Create and sustain partnerships with other IC elements; maintaining effective working relationships with ODNI, IC components and other government agencies to address issues to span multiple mission or program areas.

Lead and oversee the formulation, development, production and evaluation of a broad range of funding policies, processes, and guidance on subject areas, including mission enabling functions and intelligence oversight disciplines, and communicate these funding policies, processes, and guidelines to community stakeholders.

Direct the development and implementation of controls and policies to provide guidance to management officials, and coordinate internal and external initiatives to ensure alignment of funding resources with key intelligence priorities.

Oversee and manage the review, editing, coordination and production processes for budget justification materials to ensure timely delivery to Congress, and monitor and summarize IC component Congressional budget actions and provide substantive input for appeals to Congressional budget markups.

Review and provide substantive input to IC and DoD Congressional budget testimony, responses to Congressional queries, Questions for the Record, Congressionally Directed Actions, and letters, memoranda and reports regarding program, budget and execution issues.

Manage and provide leadership, direction, and guidance for the development and implementation of a resource allocation and management system IAW the Directorate's mission, goals and objectives.

Provide leadership and strategic guidance on the formulation of fiscal year budget builds, Intelligence Program Budget Submission, Director's Decision Documents, Congressional Budget Justification Book, and any other resource exercises.

Lead in the development of a consolidated PC budget plan; coordinate and assess this plan with component level spend plans; and maintain oversight for the DDNI/MI priorities.



Possess expertise in contract management, contract officer technical representative's responsibilities to provide direction and oversight of PC contract activities.

Provide expert resource advice and assistance as necessary across all levels of the organization.

Lead a professional staff, assess performance, oversee goal setting, and provide feedback on personal and professional development. Interact with managers to ensure compliance and collaboration with policies which aides in developing the organizational culture.

Lead the development of a workforce and implementation of a culture that delivers services that exceed customer expectations.

Mandatory and Educational Requirements

Demonstrated analytical and critical thinking skills, including the demonstrated ability to think strategically, identify requirements, evaluate tradeoffs, and develop recommendations.

Expert knowledge of budget formulation, programming, and budget execution processes for IC programs, a defense agency or a military service.

Superior ability to apply analytic, diagnostic, and qualitative techniques, conduct independent research, filter and synthesize data sufficient to identify and evaluate alternatives and produce clear, logical, and concise products and recommendations to resolve complex, interrelated program and budgetary problems and issues.

Demonstrated superior organizational and interpersonal skills, specifically, the ability to plan strategically and manage competing priorities, the ability to negotiate, build consensus, and work effectively in a collaborative environment, and the ability to establish and maintain professional networks across all levels of management both internal and external.

Possess superior oral and written communication skills.

Expert knowledge of the IC, DoD, Office of Management and Budget, and Congressional budget processes and procedures.

CURRENT FEDERAL EMPLOYEES APPLYING FOR A DETAIL ASSIGNMENT:

Applicants from federal agencies within the Intelligence Community (IC) may be considered for this position as a reimbursable detailee, if endorsed by the employing agency. Applicants must have current TS/SCI clearances with polygraph or have the ability to obtain one. The ODNI does not conduct polygraphs or provide security clearances for detailees.

Applicants from federal agencies outside the IC must provide:

- a. **WRITTEN ENDORSEMENT** from the employing agency concurring with the detail.
- b. **RESUME:** Applicants are encouraged to carefully review the vacancy announcement, particularly the MDRs, and construct their resume to highlight their most significant experience and qualifications relevant to this job opportunity.
- c. **PERFORMANCE EVALUATIONS:** Applicants are required to provide their two most recent performance evaluations. A justification is required in the cover letter if the applicant is unable to provide the two most recent evaluations.
- d. **POSITION NUMBER:** Reference the position number in the subject line of the email and on each document submitted.
- e. **CURRENT SF-50:** Federal Government employees must provide an SF-50, "Notification of Personnel Action" to verify current federal status, position, title, grade, and organization of record. Please disregard if you are not a Federal Government employee.
- f. **COVER LETTER:** Applicants must submit a cover letter as a supplement to the resume to elaborate on their qualifications and previous work performed.
