Position Information

This is an opportunity for:

- An internal candidate to fill a SNIS Professional Tier 1 cadre position.
- A Federal Government employee to serve on a two-year reimbursable detail assignment in the ODNI. The detail assignment may be extended an additional year if all parties agree.

Who May Apply

Only Senior Service (SNIS, SES, SIS, DISES, DISL) candidates and highly qualified GS-15s may apply.

Former members of the Peace Corps may be considered for ODNI employment only if five full years have elapsed since separation from the Peace Corps.

- For a cadre assignment:
 - Current ODNI permanent cadre.
- For a detailee assignment:
 - Current Federal Government employees. Only Senior Service (SNIS, SES, SIS, DISES, DISL) candidates and highly qualified GS-15s may apply.



Salary Determination

- The ODNI uses a rank-in-person system in which rank is attached to the individual. A selected ODNI candidate or other Federal Government candidate will be assigned to the position at the employee's current GS grade and salary.
- A current Federal Government employee, selected for a detail, will be assigned to the position at his or her current grade and salary.

*** OPEN UNTIL FILLED: This announcement will be open until the position is filled. Cut off points are scheduled in two-week increments. After each two-week cut-off point, all compliant applications received to include applicants from previous submission cut-off points will be reviewed for consideration.***

Component Mission

National Security Partnerships synchronizes IC support and whole of government efforts with federal, state and local governments, the private sector and the Department of Defense, ensuring IC outreach is coordinated, timely and relevant. It also provides key leadership for activities in four domains that operate across national sectors – aviation, maritime, space and cyber -- bringing the IC's activities in these domains into alignment, and facilitating coordinated engagement internal to the ODNI, across the IC and with the rest of the federal government.

- Establish and maintain enduring partnerships with private sector entities, ODNI components, Intelligence Community elements and other U.S. Government organizations.
- Lead, manage, and direct a professional level staff, evaluate performance, collaborate on goal setting, and provide guidance on personal and professional development opportunities.
- Establish and enhance ODNI and IC-wide working groups to improve transparency and synchronization of private sector engagement activities, to include information sharing mechanisms and tools to better leverage engagement efforts.



- Develop and support ODNI leadership engagement with private sector entities.
- Develop and lead private sector engagement activities that contribute to the strategic goals and long-term planning efforts of the National Security Partnerships Directorate.
- Represent the ADNI and/or Deputy ADNI at meetings, conferences, and other public forums as needed.

Mandatory and Educational Requirements

- Demonstrated expertise and experience engaging with a variety of private sector organizations, especially in areas with a national security/economic security nexus.
- Demonstrated expertise and competence managing a senior staff, and providing innovative, results-oriented transformational leadership in the IC and/or the private sector.
- Demonstrated ability to think critically and strategically; understand complex intelligence, operations, and security issues; interact and collaborate with individuals from diverse professional backgrounds; and develop policies and issues for decision makers.
- Experience initiating, cultivating and maintaining productive working relationships with IC elements and other USG stakeholders, proven expertise working in an interagency environment, and demonstrated ability to successfully manage and align multiple projects, capabilities and strategies to promote intelligence capabilities and national security programs.
- Superior ability to communicate clearly and simply, with the experience to effectively communicate organizational vision and align employee and program performance to the mission.
- Experience in and knowledge of private sector relationships and information sharing efforts with other USG departments and agencies

Desired Requirements

- Prior experience as a senior leader in the ODNI or an IC agency. Outstanding performance in Tier 1 or GS-15 senior executive positions.

Applicants must have current TS/SCI clearances with polygraph or have the ability to obtain one. The ODNI does not conduct polygraphs or provide security clearances for detailees. ***Applicants from within the IC must submit an application through the classified [IC Joint Duty Program website](#).***

Applicants from federal agencies outside the IC must provide:

- a. **WRITTEN ENDORSEMENT** from the employing agency concurring with the detail.
