Position Information

This is an opportunity for:

- An internal candidate to fill a SNIS Executive Tier 1 cadre position.
- A Federal Government employee to serve on a two-year reimbursable detail assignment in the ODNI. The detail assignment may be extended an additional year if all parties agree.

Who May Apply

Senior Service (SNIS, SES, SIS, DISES, DISEL) candidates and highly qualified GS-15 employees may apply.

Former members of the Peace Corps may be considered for ODNI employment only if five full years have elapsed since separation from the Peace Corps.

- For a cadre assignment:
 - Current ODNI permanent cadre.
- For a detailee assignment:
 - Current Federal Government employees. Senior Service (SNIS, SES, SIS, DISES, DISEL) candidates and highly qualified GS1-5 employees may apply.



Salary Determination

- The ODNI uses a rank-in-person system in which rank is attached to the individual. A selected ODNI candidate or other Federal Government candidate will be assigned to the position at the employee's current GS grade and salary.
- A current Federal Government employee, selected for a detail, will be assigned to the position at his or her current grade and salary.

Component Mission

The National Counterterrorism Center (NCTC) leads our nation's effort to combat terrorism at home and abroad by analyzing the threat, sharing that information with our partners, and integrating all instruments of national power to ensure unity of effort. The Center serves as the primary organization in the United States Government (USG) for analyzing and integrating all intelligence possessed or acquired by the USG pertaining to terrorism and counterterrorism, and its Director serves as the Counterterrorism Mission Manager. NCTC also serves as the central and shared knowledge bank on known and suspected terrorists and international terrorist groups, as well as their goals, strategies, capabilities, and networks of contacts and support. In addition, NCTC conducts strategic operational planning for counterterrorism activities, coordinating and integrating the efforts of departments and agencies across the Federal Government.

Major Duties and Responsibilities (MDRs)

- NCTC's Directorate of Intelligence (DI) was mandated by Congress to be the primary organization in the United States Government (USG) for analyzing and integrating terrorism intelligence. The DI provides senior policymakers with integrated and coordinated terrorism analysis and produces the full range of analytic products, including daily Terrorism Intelligence Briefs, President's Daily Briefs, warning products, short-term and longer-term research, and alternative analysis. The National Counterterrorism Center's Directorate of Intelligence (NCTC/DI) is seeking an exceptional, experienced SNIS or GS-15 analytic manager with strong leadership, analytic tradecraft, and interpersonal skills to lead the group which monitors, analyzes, and integrates all-source counterterrorism (CT) intelligence on Arabian Peninsula, Iraq, and Syria for a broad set of USG customers and partners. This group provides warning of threats to US persons or interests within its area of responsibility; formulates and communicates analysis to inform policy and support operations; collaborates with partners across government to identify risk and opportunities; and drives intelligence collection through regular interaction, formal evaluations, and structured requirements. The group lead also manages issues and oversees efforts against Al-Qa'ida, Hizballah, Levant, and Egypt, Iran, and ISIS in the area. The successful candidate will lead a group of more 50 officers from across the IC—including both government employees and contractors—and be responsible for supervising and developing two Deputy Group Chiefs, two Senior Analysts, four Branch Chiefs, as well as an EXO and an EA. Major Duties and Responsibilities:
 - Set and implement a vision for the group.



- Drive the group's production, ensuring that products capitalize on NCTC's unique data access and meet the highest standards of tradecraft.
- Recruit, develop, and retain a diverse and highly qualified workforce. Ensure group personnel are appropriately challenged, rewarded, and given the support, tools, training and opportunities they need to develop and succeed. Cultivate an inclusive environment that fosters the development of all officers to their full potential.
- Clearly communicate expectations and provide subordinate managers and analysts and support personnel with timely and candid assessments of their strengths and developmental needs.
- Develop and sustain partnerships with both internal and external customers and stakeholders, providing tailored analytic support, as needed.
- Manage complex issues effectively, and appropriately empower your subordinate managers to make decisions and take action.
- Ensure that resources are aligned with mission priorities.
- Actively participate in corporate activities to advance the vision and goals of the DI, NCTC, and ODNI.
